Reverend Lawrence S. Powell delivered the invocation and Mr. Slayton led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

PUBLIC FORUM

Mr. Boone called for Public Forum at 5:36 p.m.

The following speakers requested to address the Board: (Supplementary Minute Book, Exhibit "A")

Craig Broughton, speaking as an individual, advised the Board of problems his son had experienced at N.B. Cook Elementary. Mr. Broughton mentioned that he had recently requested to transfer his son out of N.B. Cook Elementary, but was informed that it was "School Board policy" that a student could only be transferred at the end of a semester. Mr. Broughton requested that he be provided with a copy of such policy. In a separate, but related issue, Mr. Broughton commented on the "unacceptable" actions of the Assistant Superintendent for Human Resource Services. Motion was made by Mr. Bergosh and seconded by Mr. Slayton, to approve Item V.A.10, Camelot Proposed Sale Notification of Sale of Stock of CHG Alternative Education, Inc. Mrs. Hightower and Mrs. Moultrie each stated that they were not comfortable voting on this item as they had not had sufficient time to thoroughly review the backup documentation that was received just shortly before this meeting. Upon inquiry by Mr. Bergosh, the Superintendent advised that this item had been submitted as a "late addition" to this agenda at the urging of Camelot representatives. Mr. Todd Bock, Senior Vice President of Education Services, Camelot Schools of Pennsylvania, LLC, clarified that the intent of this item was to notify the Board that the sole shareholder of CHG Alternative Education, Inc. planned to sell its stock to a company controlled by Riverside Capital Appreciation Fund V, L.P. It was noted that Camelot Academy of Escambia County was currently operated by CHG Alternative Education, Inc. under an agreement approved by the Board at the March 16, 2010 Regular Meeting (see: March 16, 2010 Regular Meeting Agenda, Item V.A.8, Contract for Educational Services by and between The School Board of Escambia County, Florida and Camelot Schools of Pennsylvania, LLC). Mr. Bock explained that the parties to the Agreement intended for Camelot Schools of Florida, LLC (a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Company) to be the eventual contracting party with the Board and to be the entity through which CHG Alternative Education, Inc. operated Camelot Academy of Escambia County; therefore, Camelot Schools of Pennsylvania, LLC would request the Board's consent to assign and transfer its rights and obligations under the March 16, 2010 Board-approved agreement to Camelot Schools of Florida, LLC. It was noted that neither the sale of stock nor the transfer of name from Camelot Schools of Pennsylvania, LLC to Camelot Schools of Florida, LLC, would have any impact on the daily operation of the school. After much discussion, Mr. Slayton suggested that this item be postponed until the January 18, 2011 Regular Meeting to allow Board Members sufficient time for review. Motion was made by Mr. Slayton and seconded by Mrs. Moultrie, to postpone Item V.A.10, Camelot Proposed Sale Notification of Sale of Stock of CHG Alternative Education, Inc. to the January 18, 2011 Regular Meeting. Motion carried unanimously.
