2. Stellar Employee Recognition

The Superintendent announced that Ms. Dana Nicolet, Administrative Secretary in the Transportation Department, was the Stellar Employee for the month of February. Ms. Nicolet received a plaque and pin from the School District and a check in the amount of \$100 donated by Members First Credit Union.

3. Military Recognition Day – Resolution

The Superintendent read the following resolution:
