INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Dr. Calvin Avant, Executive Director of Escambia-Pensacola Human Relations Commission (EPHRC), delivered the invocation. Mrs. Moultrie led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

PUBLIC FORUM

Mr. Slayton called for Public Forum at 5:30 p.m.

The following speakers requested to address the Board: (Supplementary Minute Book, Exhibit "A")

■ Teresa Almon, speaking as an individual, expressed some of her concerns with the proposed amendments to the Exceptional Student Education Policies and Procedures (SP&P) document (*Item III.A.1*). The Superintendent said that the appropriate staff member would contact Ms. Almon to discuss her concerns.

I. CALL TO ORDER/ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Mr. Slayton called the Regular Meeting to order at 5:40 p.m. The Superintendent noted the amendments as outlined on the agenda. There being no objections with the changes to the agenda, Mr. Slayton called for a motion to adopt the agenda (*as amended*). Motion by Mr. Boone, seconded by Mrs. Hightower, to adopt the agenda (*as amended*), was approved unanimously.

II. COMMITTEE/DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

1. PTA Presentation

Ms. Deanna Neal, President of the Escambia County Council PTA (ECCPTA), gave a brief report on the recent and upcoming events and activities of the PTA.

2. Stellar Employee Recognition

The Superintendent announced that Ms. Bonita Davey, Network Infrastructure Specialist, was the Stellar Employee for the month of March. Ms. Davey received a plaque and pin from the School District and a check in the amount of \$100 from Members First Credit Union.

3. Recognition of National Board Certified Teacher

The National Board for Professional Teaching Standards was established in 1987 as an independent, nonprofit, nonpartisan organization to develop a voluntary, national process for certifying teachers. The goal of NBPTS is to improve student learning by strengthening teaching skills through the establishment of high and rigorous standards for what accomplished teachers should know and be able to demonstrate. National Board Certification is a voluntary assessment program designed to recognize and reward outstanding teachers to help them grow in their profession.

Ms. Candice Blackburn, teacher at Molino Park Elementary School, was recognized for achieving National Board Certification. The Superintendent noted that with the addition of Ms. Blackburn, the Escambia County School District now had a total of 197 National Board Certified Teachers.

Mr. Slayton called for public hearing; however, there were no speakers. NOTE: Ms. Teresa Almon expressed some of her concerns with the proposed amendments to this document during the Public Forum segment of this meeting. Motion was made by Mrs. Moultrie and seconded by Mr. Boone, to adopt amendments to the District School Board Exceptional Student Education Policies and Procedures (SP&P). Mr. Bergosh reiterated concerns that he had previously expressed at the February 17, 2012 Regular Workshop and the March 16, 2012 Regular Workshop. He said that he would not support the adoption of this document based on the concerns that he had expressed during those previous sessions. Mr. Bergosh understood that most of the information outlined in this document was prescribed by the Florida Department of Education (FLDOE), but he hoped that the next time this document was presented for the School Board's consideration that School Board Members would actually be afforded an opportunity to "have some say" in those sections where the School District did have latitude for input. In light of the concerns expressed by Ms. Almon during Public Forum, Mrs. Hightower suggested to the Superintendent that it might prove helpful to assemble a group of parents to review this document and provide feedback on whether the procedures outlined in the document were in fact being followed in the School District. The Superintendent said he was not opposed to Mrs. Hightower's suggestion and advised that there were already plans in place to strengthen the communication with parents and to improve the education of parents so they better understand the process.

Motion was approved 4 to 1, with Mr. Bergosh voting "No."

Motion was made by Mr. Boone and seconded by Mr. Slayton, to accept the Superintendent's recommendation that employee #8123-063-01 be suspended without pay for three (3) working days beginning Wednesday, March 28, 2012, based on misconduct as more specifically identified in the notice letter to the employee. Mrs. Hightower said that she would not support the motion to accept the Superintendent's recommendation as did not believe that the recommended discipline was appropriate for the infraction committed by this employee. Mr. Bergosh added that for this employee, there had been a previous pattern of similar infractions. Although he understood that the School District practiced "progressive discipline," in this case he did not believe that the recommended discipline was sufficient. He said that he would "not condone keeping an employee who steals money from a school and deprives that school of use of those funds for kids." Mr. Bergosh said he too, would not support the motion as the Superintendent's recommended discipline for this employee was too lenient. Mr. Boone commented that "the punishment needs to fit the crime" and in this particular case he did not believe that it did. The Superintendent advised that he and his discipline committee had reviewed this case thoroughly and felt like this was the most appropriate recommendation that could be supported or sustained in this particular case. Dr. Alan Scott, Assistant Superintendent for Human Resource Services, advised that the Superintendent's discipline committee had made this recommendation based on advice received from the Superintendent's attorney, Mr. Joe Hammons. Dr. Scott reminded School Board Members that "there is a difference between what you know and what you can prove" and in this case, the recommendation was based on the facts that could be substantiated and proven. The Superintendent added that any discipline recommendation was a "judgment call" taking into account all the evidence that could be substantiated and the advice of his attorney. Mr. Slayton reminded Board Members that if the motion to accept the Superintendent's recommendation was rejected by a majority vote of the School Board, then there would essentially be no punishment for this employee. Upon inquiry by Mrs. Hightower, the Superintendent confirmed that this employee's supervisor had been advised that as part of the punishment for this infraction, this employee would be removed from any financial duties. Mrs. Hightower questioned whether the School Board had the ability to suggest an alternative punishment. In response, Mrs. Waters advised that the School Board did of course, have the right to suggest a punishment; however, the School Board did not have the ability to make the Superintendent follow that suggestion. As to whether the School Board had the constitutional authority to "use an amendment to the motion to change the punishment," she was not comfortable giving an opinion at that time. The Superintendent said that in light of the School Board's concerns, he might consider additional days of suspension for this employee but would still not recommend termination; he also noted that he would have to re-notice the employee if there was change in his recommendation prior to the School Board taking action. Mr. Bergosh expressed some frustration with not having received all of the information pertaining to this particular case. Mrs. Moultrie suggested that this item be tabled to allow Mrs. Waters to research the question posed by Mrs. Hightower, and to allow School Board Members additional time to discuss the issue with Mrs. Waters prior to taking action on the Superintendent's recommendation. Motion was made by Mrs. Moultrie and seconded by Mrs. Hightower, to postpone this item to the April 17, 2012 Regular Meeting. Motion to postpone carried unanimously.
