<u>ICARE Program</u> – On January 17, the ICARE program would be relocating from Brentwood Middle to Lincoln Park Primary. School Board Members could expect to receive an invitation to an open house event planned for the first week in February.

Joint Meeting with Escambia County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) – It was the desire of the BOCC to host a joint meeting with the School Board. Upon inquiry by Mr. Adams, Mr. Terry St. Cyr, Assistant Superintendent for Finance & Business Services, said the reduction in operating funds for guidance services, was simply a realignment of budgetary allocations based on expenditures.

Mr. Shawn Dennis, Assistant Superintendent for Operations, took a moment to explain the reason for the rate differences in each of these contracts. Prior to the negotiation of these contracts, all schools consuming natural gas were paying a standard fixed rate of \$4.95/MMBTU; now schools would pay a rate of \$2.95/MMBTU to \$4.95/MMBTU, based on consumption volume and resulting in a net savings in overall natural gas costs.
